

CPSP-only Fee Conditions Examples

<p>Adolescent</p>	<p>Mary is 16 and is in year 10 at high school. She is autistic and is struggling at school. Mary is on the NDIS and is funded for speech pathology supports. Her mother has referred her for help with school, homework, and communicating effectively at home, via the CPSP-only service.</p> <p>----</p> <p>Mary’s assessment will take several sessions, but it’s unknown how many. Her report will be long and might support extra help at school. Her parents asked the CPSP to include a review of all previous reports (3 x reports), which was anticipated to take another 30 minutes.</p> <p>----</p> <p>Mary’s mother agrees to book two 60 minute sessions and understands that there is 60 minutes of non-face-to-face time required to prepare for these. She pays \$581.97.</p> <p>----</p> <p>Mary has a lot of difficulty in the sessions. As part of Mary's assessment, the speech pathologist suggests that an interview with Mary's teacher would be beneficial. The speech pathologist arranges a phone meeting with Mary's teacher, with parent consent. This meeting is 45 minutes duration, with 15 minutes billed for notes and prep per NDIS recommended rates. Mary's parents pay \$193.99 for this meeting/interview.</p> <p>----</p> <p>After the 3 sessions, a comprehensive assessment report is developed, which took the clinician 60 minutes to analyse and another 120 minutes to analyse and prepare (it is 8 pages in total) Mary’s parents pay \$581.97 for the report completion. In total, Mary’s parents pay \$1163.94 for her comprehensive service, which is funded by her NDIS plan.</p>
<p>Adult</p>	<p>Gene is 63 years old and has had cerebral palsy since birth. He was referred to the MQ Health Speech and Hearing Clinic (CPSP only) for communication supports at home where he lives at home with carer support, funded by the NDIS.</p> <p>----</p> <p>Gene can’t get to the clinic and asked to be seen at home which is 15km from the clinic. Gene agrees to book 2 x 45 minute appointments in his home, plus 15 minutes preparation and notes time per appointment (ie. 2 x 60 minutes). The drive to his house takes 30 minutes one way, so he agrees to pay another 60 minutes’ travel time per visit. The total cost of these two at-home appointments is 4 x \$193.99 = \$775.96.</p> <p>----</p> <p>Gene asked the speech pathologist to develop and deliver a training to his carers to support how he communicates at home. This included a PowerPoint presentation design (2 hours), delivery (1 hour), and handouts for the carers (1 hour). This was delivered via Zoom as Gene requested, to 3 carers and Gene’s family. In total, Gene pays another \$775.96.</p>

Teaching Clinic Assessment Examples

Paediatric	<p>John is 3 years old. He has been referred to the clinic because his preschool has reported very minimal and unclear speech. When John wants a glass of milk, he points at the milk and grunts. He does not yet consistently follow instructions. John’s family report some family history of communication delay and motor skill delay.</p> <p>John has been referred to MQ Health Speech and Hearing Clinic for an assessment of his communication. His parents have selected the teaching clinic.</p> <p>----</p> <p>This would require a long assessment as we would need to assess John’s language (both expressive and receptive, 1 area), his speech sounds (1 area), and his intentional communication (1 area). This would cost \$407.37 which includes the report writing time needed.</p> <p>-----</p> <p>The Speech Pathologist split the first 90 minutes of direct assessment over 2 x 45 minute sessions, and after discussion with his parents agreed that an extra 30 minute session was also needed (\$58.20).</p> <p>----</p> <p>John’s parents therefore pay \$407.37+\$58.20. In total, his parents pay \$465.57</p>
Adult	<p>Bill is 73 years old and was referred to the MQ Health Speech and Hearing Clinic for an assessment of a stutter which has returned. Bill had a stroke 4 years ago and is very active with his local community. He has been referred by his neurologist.</p> <p>----</p> <p>Bill was booked for short assessment of one area (stuttering) and was quoted \$232.78. During the assessment, Bill identified that he often has swallowing problems, and has recurring chest infections. He also stutters during his speech and has trouble thinking of the right word.</p> <p>----</p> <p>Bill’s speech pathologist spoke to he and his partner. They discussed that Bill requires a long assessment as he has many areas of concern. They agree to extend the session by half an hour, and that an extra hour of analysis will be needed. They pay another \$174.58. In total, they pay \$407.37.</p>
